About Us

Surf Life Saving GB (SLSGB) is a charity (Charity No: 1015668 Company Registration No: 2678080) and National Governing Body established to save lives on Britain's beaches and engage in search and rescue activities and to provide education in all areas relating to lifesaving, sea, inland waters including flood search and rescue/response and resuscitation for the benefit of the public by - the provision of support for and maintenance of a network of affiliated clubs with similar objects - the promotion and improvement of national and international standards, qualifications and training in water safety, water safety event management and training, search and rescue, lifesaving, coaching, resuscitation and first aid - the promotion and organisation of beach and pool training, water sports, lifesaving and search and rescue activities for training, recreation and enjoyment that encourage fitness, team work, responsibility and excellence in pursuit of these objects - the promotion and the provision of voluntary lifesaving, search and rescue services to the community and public at large. Introduction to Data Protection

We have an obligation under Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament – the General Data Protection Regulation ('GDPR') to provide you with information about how and why we use your data. We recognise our obligations and your legal rights set out in the GDPR. We are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy by complying with the principles of the GDPR.

Registration with the Information Commissioner's Office

For the purpose of the Data Protection Act (1998) Surf Life Saving GB is registered as a data controller with the Information Commissioners Office with the registration reference of: Z2035784.

Surf Life Saving GB is committed to ensuring that personal information is held fairly, lawfully and securely in accordance with data protection laws.

This policy covers the different elements of personal information we collect from you, what we do with the information, how long we will hold it, what we won't do with the information, as well as what rights you have.

Personal Data Collected by SLSGB

'Personal data' means any information relating to an individual ('data subject') who can be identified, directly or indirectly by the information.

The data we collect about you will vary, depending on our relationship with you. Below are examples of the sorts of data that we may collect



- Full name
- > Address
- Date of Birth and age
- Gender
- Emergency contact/ Next of kin
- Special categories of data such as medical conditions, allergies, ethnicity, disability, occupation, hobbies
- Imagery (photos video's)
- Criminal convictions/offences
- Club roles
- Training records and qualifications
- Records of participation at competitions and events

Lawful Basis for Obtaining and Using Your Information

- Consent (examples below)
 - Promoting our activities, events and services
 - Sending newsletters
- Contract (examples below)
 - To administer and manage our relationship with members and affiliated clubs.
 For example, when given personal information either directly or via a Club
 Secretary during the affiliation process
 - To send members information relating to their membership, training courses and events
 - To administer attendance on training courses or competitions and to enable online assessments (where applicable).
- Legal obligation (examples below)
 - To comply with safeguarding requirements
 - To comply with health and safety requirements for example to endure the safe running of events
- Legitimate interest (examples below)
 - To comply with awarding bodies accreditation obligations
 - o To administer and monitor attendance at events and training courses
 - To properly administer your membership, awards and qualifications
 - We have a legitimate interest to maintain results from sporting events
 - We have a legitimate interest to record information on patrols

Secure storage of data

All personal data is stored securely.



Your rights

Right of access	You have the right to obtain confirmation as to whether or not personal data concerning you are being processed, and, where that is the case, you have the right to access that personal data.
Right to rectification	You have the right to oblige us to rectify inaccurate personal data concerning you. Taking into account the purposes of the processing, you have the right to have incomplete personal data completed by providing a supplementary statement.
Right to erasure (right to be forgotten)	You have the right (under certain circumstances, but not all) to oblige us to erase personal data concerning you.
Right to restriction of processing	You have the right (under certain circumstances, but not all) to oblige us to restrict processing of your personal data. For example, you may request this if you are contesting the accuracy of personal data held about you.
	You have the right (under certain circumstances, but not all) to oblige us to provide you with the personal data about you which you have provided to us in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format. You also have the right to oblige us to transmit the data to another controller.
Right to withdraw consent	If the lawful basis for processing is consent, you have the right to withdraw that consent.
Right to object to direct marketing	Where your personal data are processed for direct marketing purposes, you have the right to object at any time to processing of your personal data for marketing, which includes profiling to the extent that it is related to such direct marketing.
